



Anti-Bullying Week

This week the theme has been 'Choose Respect' which mirrors well our value for this month. The children have been discussing how we show respect and how we receive it. Each class has also done some work for display with some really powerful messages.

"Bullies are just normal people on the outside" Year 4


"We should be kind to everyone".
