## PARKING ON SITE

Please be advised that parking in our school car park is not permitted at drop off and pick up times (including pre-school parents) unless agreed by the office or you own a blue badge. If you do need to enter the school car park in between these times, then we would be grateful if you could ensure the main gate is closed on your way out. This will enable us to ensure that our site is safe for our pedestrian users.

### **School Uniform**

It has been wonderful seeing the children return looking smart wearing their Maple Tree uniforms with pride. We encourage all children to wear uniform at Maple Tree, as we believe that it creates a sense of belonging and identity for the children.

Our current uniform expectations are that all the children wear navy trousers, shorts or skirts with a royal blue knitted jumper or cardigan. In Mulberries only, we also accept navy joggers or leggings. From Reception to Year 2 the children wear white polo shirts under their jumpers whereas from Year 3 up the children wear white shirts with a clip on tie. Across the school, yellow or blue checked summer dresses are allowed in the warm weather. All children should be wearing smart black school shoes: no heels, trainers or strappy sandals allowed. Velcro fastenings are much appreciated in the younger years where pupils can't yet tie their own laces.

It has been brought to our attention, however, that navy trousers/skirts are quite difficult to come by and can be more expensive so we will, therefore, accept black as an alternative colour this year in order to allow parents to keep costs down and to purchase trousers and skirts more easily.

#### **Parent Forum**

Our parent forum meet 6 times a year (once per half term) to take part in discussion surrounding whole school issues such as vision or anti-bullying as well as being an opportunity to raise relevant and pertinent questions about things such as pick up and drop off, communication, uniform, general questions etc. The meetings are run by the Head and Deputy Head and are attended by a parent representative from each year group. These parents nominate themselves and are agreed by the rest of the parents in that cohort. The reps collect questions and topics for discussion from the parents and feedback after the meeting - though formal minutes are also circulated to all parents following the meeting.
