MESSAGE TO PARENTS AND CARERS FROM THE EXECUTIVE HEAD

Sometimes the world looks a very uncertain place doesn't it? Uncertainty puts everyone on edge. Communities like ours become anxious when changes are forced on them and facilities that they rely upon to help them feel secure alter or get taken away from them. Of course change for the better is welcome, but often change can feel as if there is a hidden agenda behind it. When changes involve our children, then we get very worried indeed. We are left with all sorts of questions. Sometimes we are not even sure what questions we should be asking. Schools form the heart of our community of families. People get used to their schools. Each school has its own character and reputation, offering different facilities, resources and values to our children. Many of you will have been to schools here yourselves. In the 23 years I have been at Sandye Place I have got to know so many of you, teaching several generations of some families. One thing I can claim with some authority is that I know this community from the <u>inside out</u>. You have trusted me and it has been me and my team's privilege and inspiration to serve you. This is my home too, and I care deeply about all of us. There has been so much uncertainty about the changes that our schools are going through. We have all been going through it with you, feeling the same concerns, waking at night, worried for you and the children to whom we dedicate every day.

This has spurred us on nevertheless – and we have created something we feel really proud of, to offer and to explain to you.

We have been looking at how we can continue to offer everything you are accustomed to by minimising the changes to our age range, and at the same time expanding our provision to all of you, our families, so that you can access inexpensive wrap around care from the earliest years right through to the end of year 8. My many years of experience here have allowed us to reorganise in subtle, relevant and meaningful ways. For example by amalgamating Maple Tree and Sandye Place into a continuous single Academy we can create seamless continuity, with the developmental needs of each age group fully catered for, and all inside the consistent culture of care you have come to expect.

The details of our vision are contained in the consultation document that we sent to you. Our vision will need to be approved by the Department for Education. To help this process I genuinely need your approval, feedback and responses, so please, please take time to get back to us with your reactions and ideas as soon as you can. Come in to see us for our consultation evenings, the dates, times and locations you will find in the document.

With our passion and your enthusiastic support we can offer something familiar but even better, something that amounts to a real choice for our community, peppered through with added value.

You can, and deserve to have a variety of great school offerings throughout Sandy that can serve our wonderful town and our growing population long into the future.

Thank you for your many years of support. I am excited to hear back from you as soon as you can.



Tuck Shop


Tuck shop money needs to be brought in on the day in a named envelope in the right amount. The class teacher cannot be responsible for individual money that the children bring in.
