

## **MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD**

I hope you have all had a good week. Things are going well in school at the moment though we have had a large number of children absent this week. It is a really difficult time and finding the balance between what is a normal cough and what might be a Covid cough is going to take some time. I would ask that you keep in mind the key symptoms and if your child doesn't have a temperature with their runny/bunged up nose then, if they are well enough, they can come into school.

We are also aware that the circumstances surrounding testing can take some time and where a test is needed, self-isolation has to happen until a negative test result occurs. We are grateful to you all for keeping us informed regarding your child(ren)'s absence.

We have been working on our remote learning policy which we will share with you next Friday. This will explain what will happen if a small group are self-isolating, or where we may have to close a bubble and more children would have to stay at home.

Our intention is to keep the bubbles open and running as normal as they can be for the children, but I am sure you will also appreciate that staff may also have to self-isolate if they, or a member of their family, displays symptoms. We hope that we would be able to give you as much notice as possible should we have to ask children to self-isolate (if we have a positive case) but please be aware that your child may come home at various points and say they have had a different adult leading the class; this is so we can endeavor to provide the children with a member of staff to avoid closure, but it does mean we may have to move adults around to accommodate this.

It is quite obvious that the virus remains amongst us for the moment but school life will continue in everyway possible.

On that note, later in this newsletter, you will find some lovely examples of work that the children have created since returning. It has been a great project for the children to work collaboratively on and to help settle them in during their transition.
