I have seen Year 2 taking part in a fast reactive Phonics game with secure knowledge and, again, high levels of cooperation which was impressive and I also spent some time with Reception who were so keen to share what they were doing - a mixture of topic themed activities and Chinese New Year (Lunar New Year). Children demonstrated great concentration and a real enthusiasm to talk about their learning. The children at Maple Tree continue to impress and we look forward to sharing more with you at Parents' Evenings next week!
