This week in Year 6

Welcome to the second Elder class newsletter. As ever, we have been very busy this term. Enjoy a snapshot of what we have been learning this term—so far.



Geography

This term in geography we have been learning about the polar climates. We have compared and contrasted the North and South Pole

and looked at the biomes of these regions.


We have made links to science and how the flora and fauna of the Michael's experiences. areas have adapted to suit this.

History

As part of our learning on the Arctic and Antarctica, we learned about the race for the South Pole. We were able to order the navigators and explorers into chronological order. We discussed whether we would like to have explored the poles in the early part of the 20th Century or now—we all decided we would prefer to go now!

Maths— this week we have been learning about statistics. We have read and interpreted line graphs, dual bar charts and pie charts. We have also begun learning how to construct a pie chart. We know that pie charts has a connection to our learning about fractions, decimals and percentages. We have been thoroughly immersed in our class text, Skellig.


Each day we read a chapter or two. This week we have begun planning a dream sequence based on



<u>Science</u>

We have been learning, firstly, about evolution and inheritance. We learned how different species have evolved and adapted over millions of years. We learned the scientific concept of inheritance and how some of our characteristics are adaptive or inherited. We also learned about how humans have evolved. During our learning, we carried out an investigation based on Darwin's Finches. We had various tools that were our beaks. We then had to 'eat' different food. The beak that picked up the most was the most likely to be the bird that would survive in that environment.

This part of the term, we will be learning about how taxonomists classify living things.



Art

This term in art we are developing our portrait knowledge. We are using a variety of techniques to portray our identity and will observe the art of Njideka Akunyili Crosby, Yinka Shonibare, Thandiwe Muriu, and Mike Barrett. In our sketch books we have created visual notes to begin building a palette for our own work.

Finally, again, thank you for all of the support you have given the children over the term with their reading and homework. We are now firmly in the run up to our SATs assessments. This is a time for every child to show how amazing they are. However, this is not a time to worry - in school we reassure the children that they should try their best. We are so proud of all they have achieved so far this year.

Year 1: Who is Jewish? What do they believe and how do they live?

Year 2: How do we show care for others? Why does it matter?

Year 3: What is the trinity and why is it important for Christians?

Year 4: How do festivals and worship show what matters to Muslims?

Year 5: What helps Hindu people as they try to be good?

Year 6: What will make our community a more respectful place?
