MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD

As a headteacher, the most important things to me are teaching, learning and ensuring the children are making progress. I am passionate about what goes on both in the classrooms and on the playground and as such it has been so lovely to spend time in all classes this week; I have been so impressed with the high levels of engagement they are showing in their learning. Well done to the children and to the staff who are creating some amazing learning opportunities for the children. I have included some of my



staff who are creating some amazing learning opportunities for the children. I have included some of my highlights below:

Mulberries: our youngest children are settling so well - they are interacting with each other and learning key skills in a playful environment - already demonstrating good balancing and cutting skills as well as communicating with each other and the adults in the room.

Reception: the children are so enthusiastic in their learning and are showing increasing levels of independence. They were taking part in matching activities both indoors and out and their language to describe what they are doing was great. They engage well with each other - I don't think I have seen so many smiles together!

Year 1: a lively retelling of the parable of The Lost Son using puppets! The children loved it. They supported each other with the story and were trying really hard to use the props. A very engaging lesson!

Year 2: a very mature discussion in PSHE about how to treat others with kindness in different situations. The children were talking about the differences between right and wrong and went on to role play some of these. Such a good understanding of how to treat each other with respect!

Year 3: totally enthused with their History topic on the Stone Age and spoke excitedly about how before stones they defended themselves with sharp sticks. There was also lots of amazing recall surrounding the story of Buddha and his eightfold path and the journey to enlightenment - such a clear understanding!

Year 4: learning and note taking about the Roman Invasion. Children were able to use the dates to discuss key events and plotted these pictorially. There was some great discussion surrounding their Roman theme.

Year 5: a fascinating introduction into Biomes which took them into a discussion surrounding the prefix 'bio' with some fantastic words that came flooding out such as biometrics, biology, biography, biohazard... a way to bring the English language into a geography lesson!

Year 6: have been developing their French knowledge and understanding this week in learning the names for classroom items and using sentences to describe where they are - tres bien!
