Attendance update

We're pleased to announce that we are introducing a new, more efficient and secure system for reporting your child's absence due to illness, called Studybugs. More information



about the parent app and how to use it will follow via parentmail next week.

This is a system used by many schools in Central Beds to monitor attendance and the types of illnesses that are circulating, hence the name 'study bugs'.

Part of this system will allow school to send automated letters when your child's attendance hits particular thresholds, overseen by the office, Deputy Head and Educational Welfare Officer. These will also begin next week. Please note these letters could be generated on any day of the week and will be emailed to the email addresses registered on our system. Lumi Nova has been commissioned by East London Foundation Trust and is available to young people in years 3-6 across Bedfordshire and Luton.

Lumi Nova is ideal for children who may:

- lack confidence to try new things
- seem unable to face simple everyday challenges
- find it hard to concentrate
- have problems with sleeping or eating
- have angry outbursts
- have negative thoughts about what's going to happen
- be avoiding everyday activities, eg. going to school, seeing friends
- become irritable, tearful or clingy


